	While her lower right hand is in <i>varada</i> , her lower left hand carries the <i>kamandalu</i> . The <i>godhika</i> , her <i>vahana</i> , is seen on the upper pedestal.

		showed up. Mr. Shah Mohammad Salahuddin purchased it from a non-engali dealer. Dhaka												
		Museum purchased it from Mr. Salahuddin in 1972. As the image was not in its original												
	shape, at first glance it was not possible to identify the stolen sculpture. Later, on a close													
	examination, it was discerned that the lost image of Gauri had actually been recovered.
